Director's Note

This is not a story about time, but running out of time.

We feel the effects of it every day: the sun rising and setting, alarm clocks defining our days, and a checklist listing everything that needs to be done before the clock strikes 12. Then we wake up the next day and repeat. We live our lives being constricted by time, rather than relishing in it: relationships with friends and family dwindle, projects take over every second of our days and sleep becomes a memory from the past.

However, we find comfort in our passions such as music, art, acting, for some, and writing, reading, and training for others. These passions turn into dreams. These dreams dare us to defy the nature of time and work against it, in order for them to become realities.

This story articulates the lives of people so passionate to create something, leave a legacy, and pursue their dreams. These characters are forced to race against the clock and strive forward in an attempt to self fulfill. A concept all too familiar to many of us. Characters are told to "slow down" as they beg for "more time" resulting in a fire being lit inside of them. This fire stimulates their ambitions, driving them to complete their work before they run out of time.

Within these characters we see so many parallels, specifically between artists who are not just passionate but plagued by the idea of time. The clock ticks second by second, time fades away, and we are left questioning whether or not there will ever be truly enough time to accomplish all that we aim to achieve.

It is our hope that people leave this world with a reminder that time is not our enemy, but a powerful tool in our hands. We don't get much of it, thus it is important to make the most out of every second. Allow your dreams and passions to lead you and use time to your advantage!

What is ALS?

Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (pronounced a-my-o-TROE-fik LAT-ur-ul skluh-ROE-sis), better known as ALS or Lou Gehrig's Disease, is a disease of the nervous system, which affects nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord. ALS causes loss of muscle control, and gets worse over time. The exact cause of the disease is still not known.

ALS often begins with muscle twitching and weakness in an arm or leg, trouble swallowing or slurred speech. Eventually ALS affects control of the muscles needed to move, speak, eat, and breathe. There is no cure for this fatal disease.

ALS was first described in 1824, but was not named until 1869 when a French physician created a method for diagnosing the disease. ALS, however, wasn't a disease that was widely known, until a famous baseball player, Lou Gehrig, was diagnosed with it in 1939. Gehrig was nicknamed, "The Iron Horse" for his ability to play baseball after his diagnosis. He died on June 2, 1941.

People with ALS often die within three years of diagnosis. While there have been advances in understanding ALS, there is no cure or treatment that significantly improves motor function or extends the life expectancy for those with the disease.

Statement on the Anishinaabe Land Transfer

Anishinaabeg gaa bi dinokiiwaad temigad manda Michigan Kichi Kinoomaagegamig. Mdaaswi nshwaaswaak shi mdaaswi shi niizhawaaswi gii-sababoonagak, Ojibweg, Odawaag, minwaa Bodwe'aadamiig wiiba gii-miigwenaa'aa maamoonjiniibina Kichi Kinoomaagegamigoong wi pii-gaa aanjibiigaadeg Kichi-Naakonigewinning, debendang manda aki, mampii Niisaajiwan, gewiinwaa niijaansiwaan ji kinoomaagaazinid. Daapanaming ninda kidwinan, megwaa minwaa gaa bi aankoosejig zhinda akiing minwaa gii-miigwewaad Kichi-Kinoomaagegamigoong aanji-daapinanigaade minwaa mshkowenjigaade.

The University of Michigan is located on the traditional territory of the Anishinaabe people. In 1817, the Ojibwe, Odawa, and Bodewadami Nations made the largest single land transfer to the University of Michigan. This was offered ceremonially as a gift through the Treaty at the Foot of the Rapids so that their children could be educated. Through these words of acknowledgment, their contemporary and ancestral ties to the land and their contributions to the University are renewed and reaffirmed.
